We began this week with a Remembrance Collective Worship for those who fell during the last two World Wars and for those who continue to serve in our armed services. The children will be completing work over the coming week around the theme of Remembrance which will be shared on Friday. Thank you to Ava and Harriet who laid a wreath on behalf of the school, at St Andrew's war memorial, in remembrance of the local men and women who gave their lives during both World Wars.





Internet Safety

Thank you to all those who attended the 2 John's Internet Safety meeting last week. It was certainly very informative and quite shocking, in places, especially when they shared statistics of the rapidly increasing percentage of children in the 7-11 bracket being targeted for inappropriate images by strangers.

The 2 John's clear message to us, both as parents/carers and educators, was that communication and sharing this online world with your children is vital if we are to successfully monitor and keep our children safe. They gave the example of us taking time to play Roblox, Minecraft and watch YouTube shorts with them, in the same way that we would watch them play a football game or go with them to swimming lessons or the park. In this way we can better understand the world they are being exposed to and help them negotiate the pitfalls that they may encounter. The 2 John's urged us to not ban this world but to help our children know what to do if something worries or upsets them.








Fantastic Work

As part of their English, Year 6 have been creating non-chronological reports about their own madeup planets. Their beautiful work has been displayed and 'published' in a whole class booklet.








Nursery have been making firework shapes by cutting small snips in different coloured paper. The children have also made fireworks pictures out of 2D shapes and have created fireworks
