Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a number of visitors monitoring our school this week. On Monday we had our re-visit of the Early Years Advisor to look at the provision for our very youngest children. He was very impressed with all that Mrs Bugg and her team have put in place for our children. He particularly commented on the learning environment and all that they had done to ensure our children have easy access to resources to enrich their play and learning. We know what a wonderful and fun learning environment our Early Years is for our children and I was proud to show it off.

On Tuesday we then had our Autumn visit from our Schools Effectiveness Advisor. He led a Deep Dive-styled morning, looking at our maths provision. We completed observations in all classes and he spoke to both Miss Muncey, our Maths Subject Lead and the children about maths in our school. Once again, we saw some excellent practice and the Effectiveness Advisor spoke highly about both the provision and Miss Muncey's expertise and strong leadership in this area. Inspiring Science Work

Our Year 5 came back full of enthusiasm about the future of space exploration, having visited the STEM Space Discovery Centre in Stevenage, on Wednesday. The children I spoke to, afterwards, were able to share some really in-depth knowledge about the Mars Rover and its proposed future.



Year 3 have also been completing some investigations themselves. For homework they decorated a plate of their favourite food and then worked out the content of that meal in terms of food types and calories. A beautiful mix of art and scientific research.


OPAL

Ware Library Winter Reads initiative


