Staffing News

Hertfordshire County Council SEND Ofsted Report

We have been sent the following from HCC about their SEND Inspection, which happened last July.

"Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) have published their Area SEND inspection report of the Hertfordshire Local Area Partnership.

The [inspection report](#) identified 'widespread and / or systemic failings' across the local area partnership led by Hertfordshire County Council and the NHS Hertfordshire and West Essex Integrated Care Board (ICB), leading to 'significant concerns about the experiences and outcomes of children and young people with SEND'.

The Hertfordshire local area partnership, led by the County Council and NHS Integrated Care Board, accept the findings of the report. We recognise that too many children and young people with SEND and their families have not received the service and outcomes they need and deserve.

We are all, across the whole partnership, sorry for this and are taking urgent action to address the priority."

The report does highlight many areas which we as a school and many of our parents have been battling against over the past few years; i.e. delays in identification of SEND, lack of funding and a lack of appropriate resources and support. Despite all of these ever increasing challenges, we have



always championed all of our children, including those with SEND, and we will continue to always do so. We are looking forward to reading the HCC SEND action plan which will be published later this month and hope that there will be a tangible change in how SEND is supported by the Local Authority.

Tag Rugby

On Tuesday a team of Year 4 and a team of Year 5 children played in the Hertford and Ware Rugby Festival. Despite the inclement weather, Year 4 played really well as a team and managed to win all of their games. Unfortunately, Year 5 were only able to complete two games before the tournament had to be cancelled due to the weather. A big thank you to Mr McNaughton, who accompanied the children and survived the wind and rain!

Year 4 Trip to the British Museum



The week started with a trip out for Year 4 to learn all about the Egyptians at the British Museum. The children were given a talk about how to be historical detectives – looking for clues about the past through studying historical artefacts. They then toured the Egyptian galleries, which included galleries of monumental sculptures as well as the everyday objects discovered by archaeologists, including food stuff, shoes and jewellery.



Magic Maths!

In maths, Year 1 have been learning about 3D shapes. We have been learning the names of different shapes and exploring the properties of them by building towers to see which shapes are best to build with. We also experimented with which shapes can roll!



Vaccination UK have asked us to forward the following information:

Flu Vaccination Final Reminder

Please note this is NOT the Covid vaccination.

Dear Parent/Carer,

If your child has missed having their Flu vaccination at school, please click on the link below to book a catch-up appointment at a local clinic. You can book for both the Flu Nasal Spray and the Porcine free IM Vaccine. During last year's flu season the flu virus caused children and young people to be admitted to hospital, and some into intensive care, at increasing rates to previous years. The flu virus could make your child extremely unwell and can lead to severe ear infections and bronchitis and pneumonia (chest infections) in children and young people.

Flu vaccines are safe and very effective at reducing the risk of contracting flu. Children who have the flu vaccine are less likely to pass the virus on to friends and family, especially those who may be at greater risk from flu, such as young babies, elderly people or friends and relatives with a serious health condition.
