## School individual and sibling photos

A reminder that a leaflet was sent home with all our children this week for Bag 2 School - a company that specialises in the reuse and recycling of good quality second hand clothing. The school will be paid for the total weight collected and there is no limit, so the more bags we send, the more money we will receive!
