# St Andrew's Weekly Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

We started this week with a visit by a group of local head teachers who watched lessons, looked at the children's work and talked to the children about their learning experience at St Andrew's. This is part of our participation in a local school peer review project which is aimed to share good practice and help school improvement. The feedback I was given at the end of the day echoed our recent Ofsted report about the children's positive work ethic and learning behaviours. One of our children told them that St Andrew's was a 'joyful' school to come to, as indeed it is!



Showing their joy of learning, I have been visited by more Year 6 children sharing their WW2 models, completed at home. George had created a stunning model of a bombed home, complete with a flying bomber and exploding bomb. Owen had created a bomb shelter and was able to talk knowledgeably about the different types of shelters used during the war.

#### **Year 3 Rock Investigation**

To help Year 3 class understand the different types of rock formation, Dr Collins used different types of chocolate. They compacted milk, dark and white chocolate with pressure and

warmth from their hands to create 'sedimentary' rock. Then they put their 'sedimentary' rock into plastic bags and continued to knead it with their hands to create 'metamorphic' rock. It was inspired, and rather tasty, teaching.

# Free School Meal Eligibility

Over 6,000 households in Hertfordshire could be eligible for free school meals but so far haven't applied (Oct 23). By district, that breaks down as:

- Broxbourne 753
- Dacorum 861
- East Herts 637
- Hertsmere 679
- North Herts 554
- St Albans 488
- Stevenage 535
- Three Rivers 345
- Watford 601
- Welwyn Hatfield 715

As well as missing out on a free school meal, households could be missing out on:

- school milk (aged 5 and over)
- food vouchers during school holidays
- SaverCard which gives half-fare bus travel to 11-19 year olds (usually £20)
- help with music lesson fees
- free school holiday activity camps (www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/happy).

For each child that is eligible for a free school meal (through low income), their school will benefit from additional pupil premium which will help to improve education for pupils.
